It was brought to our attention that the website calendar had not been updated with term 3 dates and a couple of families turned up for school on Monday when we were all engaged in first aid training. This has now been corrected and we apologise for any inconvenience caused.

New Nature Play Area

Finally our new nature play area is open. We are absolutely delighted at the way it looks and the children are very excited. We have put a roster out for use at recess and lunch to ensure everyone gets an opportunity to use the area and we do not have too many children in there at one time which could result in safety issues. Each class will also have an opportunity to go with their teacher to explore the garden.

We have reinforced with the students that we need to be safe and respectful of the new area and therefore there is no running or sports equipment in the area. We need to be mindful not to walk in garden beds and damage the plants. As the plants get more established it will look even more stunning than it does now.

As with all areas in the school it is not a place to play in the morning and children are expected to go straight to class and get organised for the day.

We ask for community support in ensuring young children and toddlers do not go in the garden beds and are supervised at all times. We also ask that parents who catch up in the sheltered area by the hall supervise their children and do not allow them to climb on walls, hang off gutters and run through the gardens. We all need to work together to keep our school looking beautiful.
